Beispiel: If I **won** a trip to New York, I **would say**: "That's brilliant!"

→ Im **If-Teil** steht das Verb im **simple past**.

→ Im **anderen Teil** steht **would + der Infinitiv des Verbs**.

1. If I \_\_\_\_\_ (play) the lottery, I \_\_\_\_\_ (have) a chance to hit the jackpot.
